Please explain your reasoning and show your work.

1. Prince Charles, the eldest son of Queen Elizabeth II, is 1<sup>st</sup> in line to the throne of England. Heinrich von Pezold is 1244<sup>th</sup> in line to the throne. How many people would Heinrich have to bump off to become 1<sup>st</sup> in line to the throne?
2. How many numbers are there between 1729 and 1981, inclusive?
3. How many numbers are there between 82 and 190, inclusive? How many of them are even? How many are odd?
4. How many four-digit numbers (that is, numbers between 1000 and 9999, inclusive) are divisible by 5? How many are divisible by 12? (*Hint:* You'll need to figure out the highest and lowest such number.)
